Supporting Data for Marvin Webster's Inclusion to the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame

- In the next slides of the portfolio we will do a statistical analysis comparing the collegiate body of work with several players that have already been enshrined to the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame.
- We will first compare Marvin Webster to the great Willis Reed. We chose this comparison as Mr. Reed went to an HBCU(Grambling St.) in the same era as Mr. Webster, thus playing similar type of competition. In addition, Mr. Reed also played the Center position like Mr. Webster. Mr. Reed was enshrined into the initial 2006 Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Class.


Supporting Data for Marvin Webster's Inclusion to the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame

- We will then compare Marvin Webster to Earl Monroe. Mr. Monroe was also enshrined into the initial 2006 Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Class. Similar to Mr. Webster, Mr. Monroe played in the same era as Mr. Webster and also played similar type Division II competition as a member of Winston Salem State Basketball Team. Both Mr. Webster and Mr. Monroe led their respective teams to NCAA Division II Championships. In addition, Marvin was also named to the NCAA Division II 50th Anniversary All Elite Eight Team in 2006. 10 members were selected to this prestigious team including Marvin and 2 other members, Earl Monroe and Walt Frazier are in the Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame.
- Our next comparison will be Marvin Webster to the aforementioned Walt Frazier. Mr. Frazier played in the same era as Mr. Webster and also played similar type competition while competing in NCAA Division II at Southern Illinois University. Mr. Frazier only competed for 3 seasons while at Southern Illinois University as a result of being academically ineligible his junior season. Mr. Frazier led his team to a National Runner Up finish in the 1965 NCAA Division II Basketball Tournament. He led his team to an NIT Championship in the 1967 Season.

Supporting Data for Marvin Webster's Inclusion to the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame

- **Our next comparison will be of Marvin Webster and Robert Parish. Mr. Parish played for the smallest Division I school in the NCAA, Centenary, in Louisiana. Although a Division I school, Mr. Parish played Center for Centenary, against comparable competition as Mr. Webster in the mid 1970's. As a result of recruiting improprieties, Centenary received harsh sanctions as a basketball program and the statistics compiled by Mr. Parish have never been officially recognized by the NCAA. However, Mr. Parish was still enshrined with the initial 2006 class to the Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame.**
- **Our final comparison will be with Marvin Webster and Wes Unseld. Although, Mr. Unseld played against major Division I competition at Louisville University. We thought that if Marvin had the opportunity to play Division I basketball his style of play in terms of rebounding and points would closely resemble that of Mr. Unseld.**


Marvin Webster Vs. Willis Reed



Comparison of games played, field goals made, attempted and field goal percentage between Marvin Webster and Willis Reed.

Comparison of 4 seasons with Mr. Webster on the left and Mr. Reed on the right. Marvin had very comparable statistics to Mr. Reed, with Marvin having a superior statistical junior season and Mr. Reed a superior statistical senior season.


Marvin Vs. Willis



Comparison of total points and total rebounds between Mr. Webster and Mr. Reed over the course of their 4 year collegiate careers.

Comparison of 4 seasons with Mr. Webster on the left and Mr. Reed on the right. Marvin outperformed Mr. Reed in points and rebounds from his freshman through his junior year. Only in Mr. Reed's senior season did he attain more points and rebounds than Marvin.


Marvin Webster Vs. Willis Reed



Comparison of free throws made, free throws attempted, and free throw percentage between Mr. Webster and Mr. Reed over the course of their 4 year collegiate careers.

Comparison of 4 seasons with Mr. Webster on the left and Mr. Reed on the right. Statistically Marvin had more free throws made and attempted during his sophomore and junior campaigns, while Mr. Reed had more during his freshman and senior campaigns. Mr. Reed was a better free throw shooter in terms of percentage.

Marvin Vs. Willis




■ Points Per Game (PPG)

Comparison of points per game, rebounds per game, and opponents field goal percentage, between Mr. Webster and Mr. Reed over the course of their 4 year collegiate careers.

Comparison of 4 seasons with Mr. Webster on the left and Mr. Reed on the right. Statistically, Marvin had more points per game and rebounds per game in all of his collegiate season with the exception of his senior season. Opponents field goal percentage were pretty much the same between both players.

Marvin Webster Vs. Earl Monroe




Comparison of games played, field goals made, attempted and field goal percentage between Marvin Webster and Earl Monroe

Comparison of 4 seasons with Mr. Webster on the left and Mr. Monroe on the right. Statistically, Marvin and Mr. Monroe had similar numbers in this category from their freshman to their junior years. Earl Monroe's senior campaign is one of the best college basketball has ever witnessed as he averaged 41.2 points per game in leading his team to the Division II Title.

Marvin Webster Vs. Earl Monroe




Comparison of free throws made, free throws attempted, and free throw percentage between Mr. Webster and Mr. Monroe over the course of their 4 year collegiate careers.

Comparison of 4 seasons with Mr. Webster on the left and Mr. Monroe on the right. Statistically, Marvin and Mr. Monroe had similar numbers in this category from their sophomore to their junior years. There was incomplete data from Mr. Monroe's freshman year. Earl Monroe's senior campaign he went to the foul line almost four times as much as Marvin.

Marvin Webster Vs. Earl Monroe




Comparison of games played, total points, and total rebounds between Mr. Webster and Mr. Monroe over the course of their 4 year collegiate careers.

Comparison of 4 seasons with Mr. Webster on the left and Mr. Monroe on the right. Statistically, Marvin would certainly have more rebounds over his career as the result of playing center and Mr. Monroe guard. Total points were comparable with the exception of Marvin having a better freshman season and Mr. Monroe having a phenomenal senior season. Total games number of games only differed by four games.



Comparison of 4 seasons with Mr. Webster on the left and Mr. Monroe on the right. Statistically, points per game for Mr. Monroe were superior to Marvin's during his junior and senior year. Marvin had superior rebounding numbers. Having a superior junior year averaging 21 points and 22 rebounds for the season.


Marvin Webster vs. Walt Frazier

Comparison of 3 seasons with Mr. Webster on the left and Mr. Frazier on the right. Statistically, in just about all categories dealing with these statistics, Marvin was superior to Mr. Frazier.


Marvin Webster vs. Walt Frazier



Comparison of games played, free throws made, attempted and free throw percentage between Mr. Webster and Mr. Frazier over the course of 3 collegiate years.

Comparison of 3 seasons with Mr. Webster on the left and Mr. Frazier on the right. Statistically, Marvin went to the foul line at nearly double the rate of Mr. Frazier. Mr. Frazier shot for a higher percentage at the foul line. Marvin played 110 games compared to 64 games that Mr. Frazier played.


Marvin Webster vs. Walt Frazier



Comparison of games played, points per game and rebounds per game between Mr. Webster and Mr. Frazier over the course of 3 collegiate years


Comparison of 4 seasons with Mr. Webster on the left and Mr. Mr. Frazier on the right. Statistically, Marvin far outperformed Mr. Frazier when comparing total points and total rebounds during their collegiate careers.

Marvin Webster vs. Walt Frazier




Comparison of games played, points per game and rebounds per game between Mr. Webster and Mr. Frazier over a 3 year period.

Comparison of 3 seasons with Mr. Webster on the left and Mr. Frazier on the right. Statistically, Mr. Frazier had an exceptional freshman season besting Marvin's freshman season in points per game. However, Marvin was very consistent and outperformed Mr. Frazier in his sophomore and junior year. Mr. Frazier missed his junior year due to academic issues.



Comparison of blocks per game and percentage of team blocks per game.




ORB% – Offensive Rebound Percentage

 An estimate of the percentage of available defensive rebounds a player grabbed while he was on the floor.


TRB% – Total Rebound Percentage

Conclusion for the Inclusion of Marvin Webster to the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame

After close comparison analysis of the data present. It is abundantly clear that the collegiate career statistics of Marvin Webster are definitely worthy of enshrinement to the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame. Marvin's points, rebounds, block shots, school records and leading his school to a National Championship, are Hall of Fame worthy attributes. In comparing Marvin to some of the greats of the game that have already been enshrined to the Hall, Marvin numbers were similar and even better than Willis Reed, Frazier, Parish, Unseld and Monroe. Marvin was remarkably consistent posting a double double in each year of his collegiate career. A feat that is remarkable and rarely seen at any level of basketball in this day. Even as he was dealing with Hepatitis during his senior campaign, he still posted remarkable numbers for someone dealing with that condition. Marvin's talent was undeniable and was recognized when he was selected as the #3 overall pick in the NBA Draft. Marvin's inclusion as one of the 10 members of the 50th anniversary Division II all elite eight team speaks volumes that he belongs in the Collegiate Hall of Fame, joining Walt Frazier and Earl Monroe who are also members of the 50th anniversary team. Marvin resurrected the basketball program at Morgan State University, leading a team that had only one winning season in the 1960's, to 4 straight winning seasons, culminating with the Division II National Championship, and becoming the first HBCU team to win a Division II National title. As a result of his consistency, work ethic, and domination of the paint in terms of rebounding and blocked shots, Marvin is often mentioned with the great centers of his era, as one of the best dominant big men in the game no matter the playing level. For a collegiate career that was as accomplished as any player that has already been inducted to the hall, Marvin's inclusion is long, long overdue.
